Visiting Assistant Professor of Chemistry

Candidates must have a Ph.D. in chemistry, biochemistry, or related field. Prior teaching experience is preferred but not required. Responsibilities will include teaching general chemistry lecture as well as general chemistry and/or organic chemistry laboratory. The successful applicant will demonstrate a strong potential for supportive and effective teaching and a commitment to fostering diversity, inclusion, equity and belonging in the classroom, laboratory, and university community.

BACKGROUND

Trinity University (http://www.trinity.edu) is a secular, independent, private institution, founded in 1869. Trinity offers high-quality science, liberal arts, and pre-professional programs to approximately 2400 undergraduate students from the U.S. and more than 45 foreign countries. Lecture courses and lab courses each count as a full course. Attendance at weekly department meetings is also expected.
